The five Fire Districts of the Town of Barnstable offer the following information:
Safety in our Neighborhoods

Summer Safety Tips Hotel / Motel Safety

- ◆ Select a hotel / motel that has smoke detectors in all rooms and common areas.
- ◆ Select a hotel / motel that has a fire sprinkler installed in all rooms.
- ◆ Request to stay on the first or second floor if your hotel / motel is not fully sprinkled.
- ◆ Review all fire and safety information that is posted on the back of your room door.
- ◆ Learn the number to call for emergencies. It might be different depending on your location.
- ◆ Count the doors from your room to each exit in case of smoke.
- ◆ If you hear the alarm, leave the building according to the hotel's fire plan.
- ◆ If there is any smoke in the hallway, crawl under the smoke to the exit.
- ◆ Always close the door behind you when you leave to stop the spread of smoke down the hall.
- ◆ And...Do Not Use the Elevators!

From the Green Team

Each month the Green Team will share a tip from Attorney General Martha Coakley's 2009 Green Calendar, the August tip is **Land, Air & Water**.

Massachusetts residents can help preserve our natural resources by taking steps to safeguard our land, air and water by reporting environmental violations to the appropriate agency.

Land. Avoid the use of pesticides; learn about non-chemical alternatives. Keep items out of landfills by recycling, reducing and reusing the items you have.

Air. Plant a garden or a tree which will convert carbon dioxide into oxygen. Take public transportation instead of using a car.

Water. Replace lawns with other ground covers that use less water. Shower instead of taking a bath—a 40% savings in water use. Install low-flow shower heads.

CONSERVATION CORNER

The innovative aeration system at Lovell's Pond in Cotuit is up and running! Made possible in part by a generous grant from the MA Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs, the system provides oxygen to the pond bottom, preventing the release of phosphorous from the nutrient-rich sediments. This is good news for water quality, as summer algae blooms should be much less frequent and severe. This project is another fine example of collaboration between the Regulatory Services and Public Works Departments. Special thanks go to Town Engineer Bob Burgmann for shepherding this unique project through the construction phase. Visitors to the Lovell's Pond launch ramp can see the compressor house, hear the hum of the powerful compressor, and discern the resultant patchiness of the surface water as the bottom aerators release their bubbles in six distinct rays across the pond.

§ 403-8. Dogs on beaches and in recreation areas.

No person owning or having the care, custody or control of any dog shall allow said dog on any Town beach or recreation area from May 15 to September 15 without the written authorization of the Town Manager or Official in control of said beach or recreation area.

From the Town Collector's office:

It appears that we are finally getting a little taste of summer!

The FY2010 real estate and personal property tax bills were issued and mailed on July 1, 2009. The first quarterly payment is due and payable on August 3, 2009. A schedule of the payments was enclosed with your payment coupons; however, I will give you that schedule again:

Payment Schedule for Real Estate and Personal Property Taxes for Fiscal 2010

Preliminary Tax Bills mailed by July 1, 2009

First Quarter **due August 3, 2009**

Second Quarter **due November 2, 2009**

Actual Tax Bills mailed by December 31, 2009

Third Quarter **due February 1, 2010**

Fourth Quarter **due May 3, 2010**

We continue to use a Lockbox service to process the payments, which has proven to accelerate the payment posting and the checks getting processed in a timely manner. The return envelope has the Lockbox mailing address of P.O. Box 742, Reading, MA. This envelope should be the envelope you use to mail your real estate or personal property tax bill.

August 2009...Summertime Tips

Although Weights & Measures inspectors are continuously testing measuring devices throughout the year, there are specific seasons when the frequency of certain inspections will increase. A good example would be more frequent retail scanner inspections during the Holiday season or net weight testing on turkeys at Thanksgiving. The same applies to the summertime season and here are a few of the areas our inspectors will concentrate on during this time.

The Town of Barnstable Weights & Measures Program has tested and sealed 63 gasoline meters at 21 marinas throughout our jurisdictions. Of those 63 meters, 12 required adjustments to bring them within tolerance. Typically all marinas are inspected before the 4th of July to ensure that boaters and marinas alike are on an "even playing field." Cordage devices can be found in various businesses, however they are commonly found at marinas where they are used to measure rope or line. These devices are also tested by the inspectors.

Package checking, also known as net weight, and tare inspections are performed on many different commodities in the local businesses. A tare is the container that the product is packed in and a customer should never be charged for the packaging. Specifically during the summer months, ice is randomly selected and tested throughout locations within our jurisdiction. Meat products, especially ground beef, is another commodity that is selected for testing. Inspectors routinely weigh and test these products to ensure that the customer is not being charged for the packaging as well as confirming that the net weight that is marked is indeed correct. If the package is showing the exact weight or less, then the store is not taking the proper tare or they are packing the containers light.

The word tare can be historically traced through Middle English from Anglo French, from the Old Italian form tara and prior to that Arabic, tarha. Tarha literally means, that which is removed.

The Barnstable Weights & Measures jurisdiction includes Barnstable, Brewster, Dennis, Eastham, Harwich, Mashpee, Orleans, Sandwich and Yarmouth.

HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS

According to the Cape Cod Emergency Preparedness Handbook: "Of all the natural disasters that might affect Cape Cod, hurricanes have the potential to cause the most property damage and loss of life if adequate planning and preparation is not undertaken."

There is much you can do to better prepare yourself and your loved ones in the event we experience a significant weather emergency. In general, it is recommended that you do the following at the onset of Hurricane Season (officially started June 1st) here on Cape Cod:

1. Make a disaster plan for yourself, your family and your pets. Be sure you review it carefully with all members of your family.
2. Compile a Disaster Survival Kit.
3. Familiarize yourself with the flood risk in your area, as well as the location of the nearest emergency shelter.
4. Be prepared, ready and willing to follow the explicit directions of emergency preparedness.

Developing Your Emergency Disaster Plan

While Hurricanes can devastate communities, we have ample warning time with which to enact a plan to insure the safety of ourselves and our loved ones. When developing your disaster plan consider the following:

1. Where the emergency shelter is in your area.
2. What your evacuation route will be.
3. The elevation of your property above mean sea level.
4. Whether or not you are located in an evacuation zone.
5. If you plan to relocate in the event of a storm, where exactly do you plan to go? Make these preparations now and be sure a call to confirm will not be required as telephone communication may not be possible.
6. What will you do with your pets during an emergency? Remember, shelters DO NOT allow pets.
7. Know where the emergency shut off is in your home for electricity, the main panel, and for water and natural gas.
8. Be sure any / all important documents are gathered in one place.
9. Prepare your Survival Kit.

The Emergency Survival Kit

Should meet the needs of yourself and your family for at least 72 hours.

- ◆ Non-perishable packaged or canned foods that require little or no preparation. Don't forget a can opener! (Soup, peanut butter, canned juices, vegetables, crackers, jelly, trail mix, etc.)
- ◆ One gallon of water per person per day, extra for pets. Store water in sterile, plastic containers such as empty soft drink bottles. Be sure to change every six months.
- ◆ A basic first aid kit.
- ◆ Battery operated radio and flashlight with extra batteries.

Remember, in the event of a severe storm:

1. Secure all outdoor objects.
2. Stay away from windows.
3. Fill your tubs and sinks with water to use in your toilets if necessary.
4. Keep an eye on vulnerable neighbors.
5. If you are asked to evacuate, don't hesitate to do so!
