Parades and Other Daytime Events:

Barnstable Village – Parade starting at 9:30 a.m.

*Presented by the Barnstable-West Barnstable
July 4th Parade and Celebration Committee*

The parade will commence at 9:30 a.m. at the County Complex on Railroad Avenue; proceed down Main Street (Route 6A); left onto Mill Way and continue to the Village Hollow where it will end for various activities.

Preceding the parade will be the presentation of the ***Mercy Otis Warren Cape Cod Woman of the Year Award*** at 8:30 a.m. on the grounds of the Superior Courthouse.

Centerville - Parade starting at 10:00 a.m.

*Presented by the Bay Lane PTA at Centerville Elementary School
and Centerville Civic Association*

The parade will form on the grounds of Centerville Elementary School and proceed up Bay Lane, take a right onto Bumps River Road; left onto Park Avenue; right onto Main Street; and continue to the Centerville Recreation Building where it will end for field events.

Cotuit – Parade starting at 11:00 a.m.

Presented by the Cotuit Civic Association

The parade will begin at the Cotuit Post Office, proceed down School Street to Main Street; left on Main Street to the rear entrance of the Cotuit Elementary School, where it will end.

Hyannisport –Parade starting at 11:00 a.m.

Presented by the West Beach Club

The parade will begin at the Hyannisport Post Office on Longwood Avenue; left onto Washington Avenue; right onto Lafayette Avenue; left onto Winchester Avenue; left onto Scudder Avenue; and continue onto Dale Avenue to the West Beach Club, where it will end. **A Road Race starting at 9:00 a.m. at Hyannisport Post Office precedes the parade.**

Osterville – Parade starting at 11:00 a.m.

Presented by the Wianno Club

The parade route will begin on Webster Street in Osterville; turn right onto Sea View Avenue; turn right onto Warren Street, where the parade will end.

Hyannis – Parade starting at 4 p.m.

Hyannis Main Street – This year’s parade features bands and lots of music, including the Barnstable High School Band, Dennis-Yarmouth High School Band. The Greater Hyannis Civic Association is sponsoring a children’s bicycle decorating contest on the Village Green prior to the kick-off of the parade. The children will join the parade at that part of Main Street and ride to South Street. **Parade Grand Marshall – Lou Colombo.** Come early, shop and dine on Main Street. Parade marchers will gather on Old Colony Road, and follow Old Colony Road to Main Street, take a left on to Main Street; left onto Sea Street; left onto South Street and autos will end at the Town Hall parking lot where it will disband.

Parade Parking: Public Parking on North Street. Carpooling Suggested. Tow Zone Strictly Enforced.

July 4th – Parking Ban from 2:00 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. on Main Street, Hyannis. Main Street and South Street will be closed to motor vehicle traffic. Also all of Main Street; Old Colony Road and Ocean Street from South Street to Main Street will be closed to motor vehicle traffic beginning at 3 p.m.

- 1) Get those new dog tags out and put them on your dog. All dogs need their 2009 tags on as of July 1. If you do not have your new dog license – come on down and get it, or send your request and check by mail. Remember, beginning August 1, 2009, a new license will cost you a late fee of \$5.00 on top of the cost of your license. So save money – do it now.
- 2) July 27 is the last day to return town nomination papers to the Town Clerk's office. The earlier they are returned the better. All individuals who have taken out papers to run for office need to return them by that date. If anyone, who has taken out papers, has decided NOT to run, you need to notify the Town Clerk in writing.

From the Green Team

Each month the Green Team will share a tip from Attorney General Martha Coakley's 2009 Green Calendar, the July tip is **Summer Tips**.

Saving energy helps households save money and decreases peak demand on the electric grid during heat waves. Avoid non-essential power usage during the peak hours between 1:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m.

Cooling. Regularly service and clean your central air conditioner unit. Use properly-sized room air conditioners. Turn your air conditioner thermostat to 80 degrees or higher and turn the air conditioners off when no one is home. Use an attic fan to draw hot air out of the attic, and use a whole-house fan to draw fresh air in through windows and exhaust through roof vents.

Cooking. Use a microwave instead of the oven, or cook on a grill outside to keep cooking heat outdoors. Gas grills cause less air pollution and fewer environmental health hazards than coal or wood grills.

Long Beach and the Centerville River Walk

LOCAL CONSERVATION COMMISSIONERS COMPLETE CERTIFICATE TRAINING PROGRAM

The Massachusetts Association of Conservation Commissions (MACC) proudly announced that **Laurence Morin** and **Louise Foster**, members of the Town of Barnstable Conservation Commission, successfully completed MACC's *Fundamentals for Conservation Commissioners* certificate training course.

The goal of the eight-unit *Fundamentals* course is to provide Conservation Commissioners with the basic knowledge and practical tools essential to carrying out their many responsibilities, from administering the Wetlands Protection Act to open space planning and protection. Such training promotes sound, consistent decision-making and builds respect for Commission determinations. MACC's training program is the only comprehensive program offered to those involved with the Wetlands Protection Act and open space planning.

MACC congratulated Laurence and Louise for undertaking this training, as well as acknowledging Barnstable's Town Council for appointing people who recognize the value of training in Conservation Commission work.

MACC is a non-profit environmental organization founded in 1961 to support, educate and advocate on behalf of Conservation Commissions. In addition, MACC works for strong, workable, science-based laws and regulations regarding wetlands, other water resources, open space, and biological resources. The FY2010 real estate and personal property tax bills that will be mailed on July 1, 2009, will be once again processed through a Lockbox service. The bills will be processed electronically, which will deposit your check and credit your account in a timely manner. The envelope enclosed with your bill will be addressed to the Town of Barnstable, P.O. Box 742, Reading, MA 01867 and this is the envelope that should be used to mail your payment coupon. Your Monthly Tip to Becoming a Better Consumer By Kim Connors, Weights and Measures Program Manager

July 2009...Credit Card Changes, effective July 2010

Effective July 2010, credit card rules will change reflecting new regulations issued by the Federal Reserve. Here are a few of the changes that have been established to assist consumers regarding terms, payment and general understanding of the terms.



- Card issuers will be required to provide: 1.) a “warning” statement indicating that making only the minimum payment will increase the interest you will pay and the time it takes to repay the balance; 2.) a hypothetical example of how long it would take to pay a specific balance in full in only minimum payments are made; and 3.) a toll free telephone number that you may call to obtain as estimate of the time it would take to repay your balance using minimum payments.
- The 15-day notice requirement will be extended. Card issuers will be required to give 45-day written notice of any changes to account terms, including APR increases due to the borrower’s delinquency or default.
- Understanding the terms of your credit card will soon be easier. The card issuers will be required to adopt new disclosure formats that will make account solicitations and applications, account opening disclosures, and monthly statements more meaningful and easier to read.
- The cut-off time for receipt of mailed payments must be reasonable; 5:00 PM or later is considered reasonable under the new regulation. In addition, when mailed payments are not accepted on the due date because it falls on a weekend or holiday, card issuers must consider payments received on the next business day to be timely.

HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS

According to the Cape Cod Emergency Preparedness Handbook: "Of all the natural disasters that might affect Cape Cod, hurricanes have the potential to cause the most property damage and loss of life if adequate planning and preparation is not undertaken."

There is much you can do to better prepare yourself and your loved ones in the event we experience a significant weather emergency. In general, it is recommended that you do the following at the onset of Hurricane Season (officially started June 1st) here on Cape Cod:

1. Make a disaster plan for yourself, your family and your pets. Be sure you review it carefully with all members of your family.
2. Compile a Disaster Survival Kit.
3. Familiarize yourself with the flood risk in your area, as well as the location of the nearest emergency shelter.
4. Be prepared, ready and willing to follow the explicit directions of emergency preparedness.

Developing Your Emergency Disaster Plan

While Hurricanes can devastate communities, we have ample warning time with which to enact a plan to insure the safety of ourselves and our loved ones. When developing your disaster plan consider the following:

1. Where the emergency shelter is in your area.
2. What your evacuation route will be.
3. The elevation of your property above mean sea level.
4. Whether or not you are located in an evacuation zone.
5. If you plan to relocate in the event of a storm, where exactly do you plan to go? Make these preparations now and be sure a call to confirm will not be required as telephone communication may not be possible.
6. What will you do with your pets during an emergency? Remember, shelters DO NOT allow pets.
7. Know where the emergency shut off is in your home for electricity, the main panel, and for water and natural gas.
8. Be sure any / all important documents are gathered in one place.
9. Prepare your Survival Kit.

The Emergency Survival Kit

Should meet the needs of yourself and your family for at least 72 hours.

- ◆ Non-perishable packaged or canned foods that require little or no preparation. Don't forget a can opener! (Soup, peanut butter, canned juices, vegetables, crackers, jelly, trail mix, etc.)
- ◆ One gallon of water per person per day, extra for pets. Store water in sterile, plastic containers such as empty soft drink bottles. Be sure to change every six months.
- ◆ A basic first aid kit.
- ◆ Battery operated radio and flashlight with extra batteries.

Remember, in the event of a severe storm:

1. Secure all outdoor objects.
2. Stay away from windows.
3. Fill your tubs and sinks with water to use in your toilets if necessary.
4. Keep an eye on vulnerable neighbors.
5. If you are asked to evacuate, don't hesitate to do so!
